End of the Semester / Calendar Year Checklists:

We are at the end of another calendar year, and half way through the academic year.

Time to ease into the break, but there are some important items to check on before we go:

1. Heat! If you live in the areas of the country where it gets cold - make sure the heat isn't set too low, or turned off while you are gone.  before you leave or at
 least water it well and
 make sure it is away
 from any heat source
 and unplugged.
- Housing for next year! If you haven't

already
secured/renewed a
place for next year you may soon miss out
on the best places. You
have no doubt been
receiving notices since
October that it is time
to renew. After
January, it becomes
more difficult to find
the prime location for
next year to
accommodate you and
your friend's needs.

4. Heating systems!

Make sure the heating system is in proper operating condition. If you are a property manager, make sure you follow the local codes and manufacturer's instructions on maintenance.
