20 Years of Victims: and the battle goes on

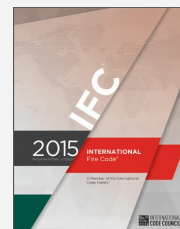

SECTION 510 EMERGENCY RESPONDER RADIO COVERAGE

510.1 Emergency responder radio coverage in new buildings.

All new buildings shall have approved radio coverage for emergency responders within the building based upon the existing coverage levels of the public safety communication systems of the jurisdiction at the exterior of the building. This section shall not require improvement of the existing public safety communication systems.

Creating a 360 Campus Fire and Life Safety Inspection Program, By: David G. Taylor; Associate Director of Life and Fire Safety Services, Gettysburg College

Campus Fire & Life Safety Professionals (CFLCP) need to develop a fire and life safety fire prevention inspection program of every facility on campus to include residential living areas. A Risk Assessment is identifying, analyzing, and weighing all the potential risks, threats and hazards to an institution internal and external environment. A fire and life safety prevention inspection program will address many of those risks and discover if a group of people or a facility is vulnerable to a fire event or life safety hazard. It allows the institution or local community to document what mitigating actions have been taken to manage these risks. Using the SWOT will help develop a good inspection program.

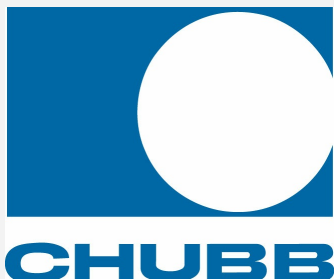

U.S. Fire Administration's Campus Fire Fatalities in Residential Buildings (2000-2015) Report

Developed by Tim O'Dowd - USFA/DHS

The U.S. Fire Administration's Campus Fire Fatalities in Residential Buildings (2000-2015) report analyzes the 85 fatal fires that took place in dormitories, fraternities, sororities and off-campus housing which resulted in 118 fatalities - an average of approximately seven per school year.


