Higher Education Opportunity Act (HEOA) & Campus Fire Safety Right-to-Know

CCFS remains busy fielding numerous inquires daily about the implementation of the fire reporting requirements – especially given October 1st was the deadline for schools to submit their first report to the US Department of Education. Guidance and reference materials to assist colleges and universities with compliance are available on the CCFS website.

Campus Fire Safety Month

The 3rd quarter is home of September which is Campus Fire Safety Month. And this year, colleges and universities across the country are conducted hundreds of events to raise students' awareness of campus fire- and life-safety. During Campus Fire Safety Month, students learn that fires do happen in campus-related settings and that they need to protect themselves no matter where they live, learn or play. CCFS provided significant resource support to many of the institutions as they planned and executed their programs.

CCFS is also pleased to report that we once again partnered with Dominos Pizza and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) to bring our "Delivering Fire Safety on Campus" message to various major cities nationwide. Webinars

We presented two webinars during the third quarter with additional programs projected in the near future.

- The first, conducted for Midwest Employers Casualty Company, a large insurance group, was an overview of CCFS and our programs, resources and capabilities. The webinar also provided an abstract of the general campus fire safety issue, along with a quick snapshot of HEOA. The invitation to work with MECC came through our partnership with URMIA.
- The second webinar came about through our long standing relationship with SimplexGrinnell. As part of SimplexGrinnell's "Learn from the Leader" series, CCFS had the opportunity to present yet again on the HEAO – this time thanks to Simplex, the message reached approximately 1,000 registered participants.
- Next quarter, CCFS will be hosting a webinar in partnership with The Door Security & Safety Foundation on the inspection requirements associated with NFPA 80 (also presenting at the Forum).
